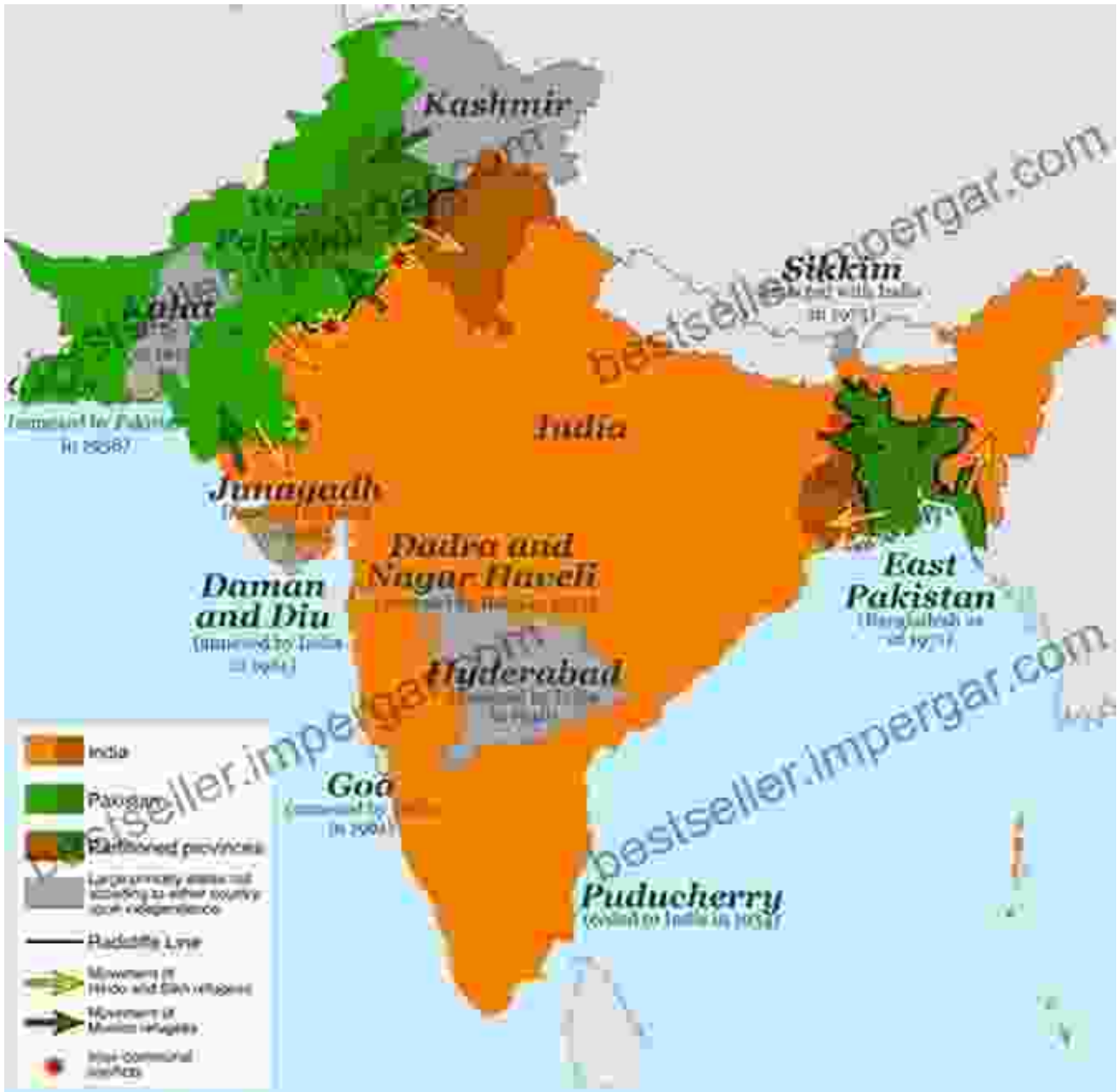

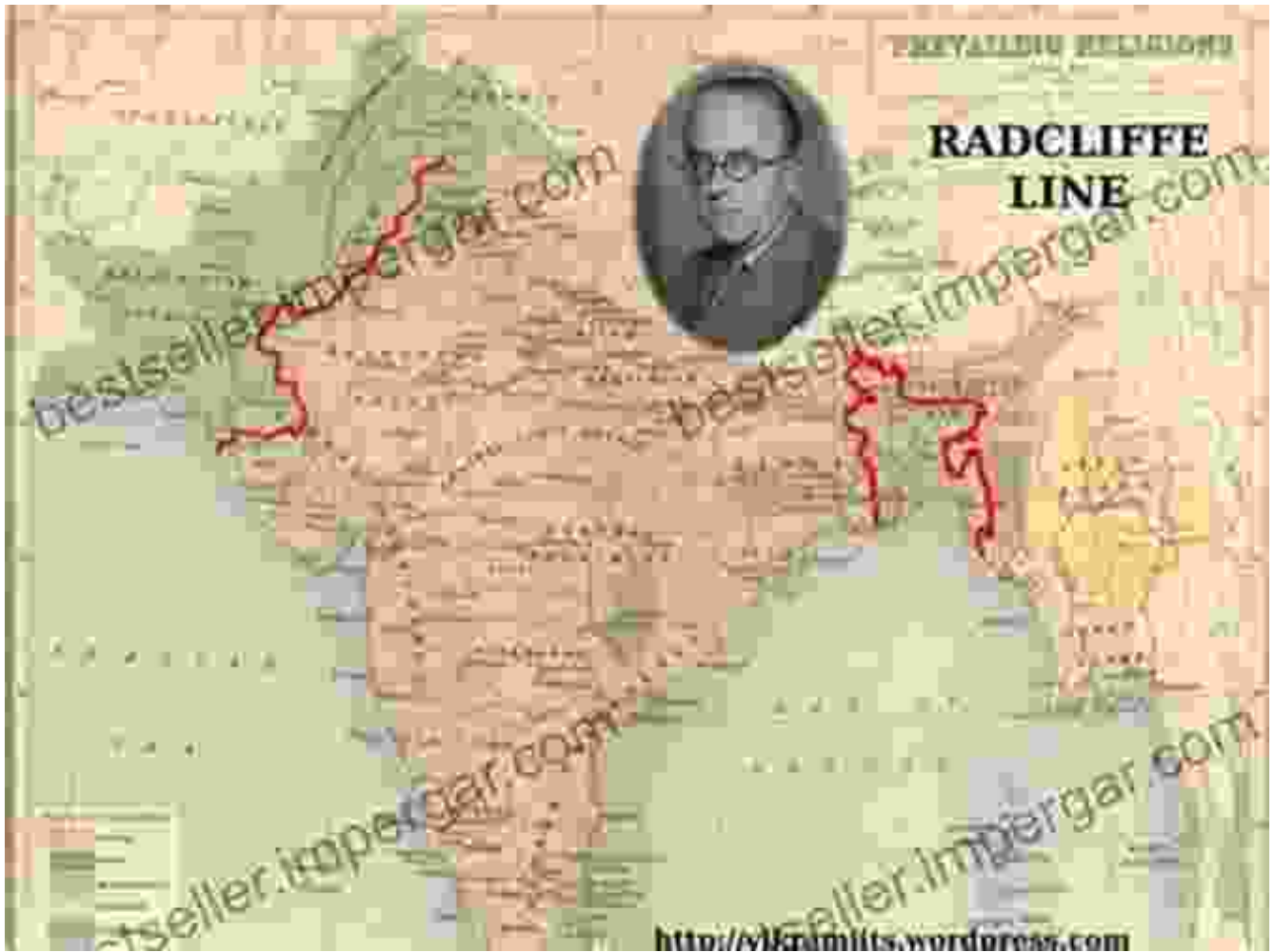

Partition of India 1947



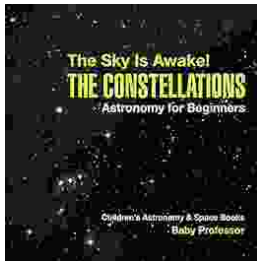

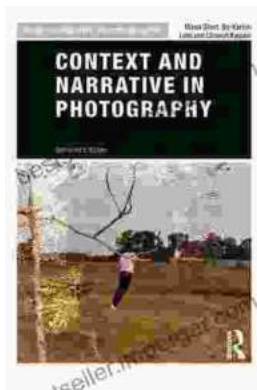
